FURTHER CHARGE

Deception Is Alleged Against Toronto Broker

Fort Erie, Ont., Oct. 28.—(UP)
—Russell G. MacMillan, 42, defendant in Canada's first test of the War Measures act foreign exchange control clause, was confronted to-day with a new charge of deceiving a crown officer.

The charge was placed against the Toronto broker yesterday when, brought to court for sentence, he changed his plea from guilty to innocent. In addition to filing the new charge, Crown Prosecutor Frank W. Griffiths asserted he would oppose any attempt to free MacMillan on bail pending trial.

Peace Justice John Hopkins set the trial date for November 6.

MacMillan was arrested last week by Royal Canadian Mounted police. He was charged with smuggling American securities into the Dominion on three different occasions. The broker pleaded guilty at the time.

Mrs. Lucy Lester, 45, also of Toronto, was seized with MacMillan and pleaded guilty to a charge of aiding and abetting the broker. She was released yesterday.
