British Mayor Thanks Hamilton

A plaque made of wood which formed a part of buildings damaged by Nazi bombs, has been received by Mayor Lloyd Jackson from the Lord Mayor of Kingston-upon-Hull, in appreciation of the help given by citizens of Hamilton to the English city during the war.

"During the early years of the war," reads the accompanying letter from J. Henson, the Lord Mayor, "when we were suffering from the results of repeated air raids, we were the appreciative recipients of many gifts of clothing and several really munificent gifts of canteens, ambulances and mobile kitchens."

The letter continues: "Since the war, we have been overwhelmed with gratitude to our many friends overseas for their most generous gifts of food which have poured in from all parts of the Commonwealth and the United States of America.

"I trust this plaque will forge a further link in the chain of friendship which binds our two cities."
