Likens Hanging To 'Act of Judas'

Medicine Hat, Alta., July 7 (CP).

—The case of Sgt. Walter Wolf, German prisoner of war charged with the hanging murder of another prisoner, Cpl. Karl Lehmann, in the Medicine Hat internment camp, Sept. 10, 1944, probably will go to an Alberta Supreme Court jury here tomorrow.

Crown Prosecutor W. D. Gow completed his address to the jury before the court adjourned Saturday. He charged that the murder was "one of the first acts of Judas," and asked the jurors to "consider this whole deed as a cold-blooded premeditated killing."

Defense Counsel G. E. A. Rice, who previously was denied an application to have the case against Wolf withdrawn and tried to military courts-martial in Germany, will address the jury tomorrow. Later Chief Justice W. R. Howson will charge the jurymen.
