AIRMAN KILLED IN ESCAPE TRY

Owen Sound, July 10 (Special).— Word has been received by the parents of the late Sergeant Pilot Harry Robertson, whose death in a German prison camp at Weimar,



was reported a short time ago, that their son died as a result of gun shot injuries received when he attempted to escape from a prison train enroute to another camp.

Sergeant Robertson had no official confirmation of their son's death, but details received today were written by a chum, "Mac," who wrote that "your son died in a courageous manner, reflecting credit on himself, his country and his family."

The letter said that full military honors had been accorded the Canadian airman, with a number of German officers in attendance as well as British officers and his friends.

"He lies where I am sure he would have wished to be—under a fir tree." The letter ended.
