AIRMAN KILLED 'N ESCAPE TRY

of their son's death, but details re-ceived today were written by a chum, "Mac," who wrote that "your son died in a courageous manner, reflecting credit on himself, his country and his family."

The letter said that full military honors had been accorded the Canadian airman, with a number of German officers in attendance as well as British officers and his friends.

"He lies where I am sure he would have wished to be-under a fir tree." The letter ended,
