

Japs Consolidating Positions in Aleutians

Tokio (From Japanese Broadcasts), June 25.—(AP)—A communique reporting that Japanese naval and military forces in the Aleutian islands had occupied Kiska on June 7 and Attu a day later claimed to-day "they are at present consolidating their positions in neighbouring islands."

The announcement, made by imperial headquarters, said that Kiska henceforth would be known as Narukami and Attu as Atsuta.

Domei said that Narukami was derived from Narukamizunei, or thunder month, one of the Japanese names for June.
